The Mission of Libraries

• The Library is a **gateway to global information**, enabling direct and remote access to Information resources in a variety of formats.

The Mission of Libraries



• The library is a <u>dynamic partner in</u> <u>imparting knowledge to users</u>, evolving to meet the changing needs of its diverse community of learners, while advancing institutional mission, values, and vision.

The Vision

As a center of intense intellectual inquiry, the Library is envisioned to be the most dynamic learning environment in the world.

In this desired future, the Librarian ensures that:

• collections remain forward-looking, diverse in breadth and form, open to browsing, and of world-renowned quality.

The Vision

- through marketing strategies, people are made aware of the resources available to them
- through innovation, access to these resources is made faster and easier.

The Vision

- to serve future users, information across all formats is preserved for the use of future generations.
- to satisfy the new breed of users, the Library's physical and virtual spaces are well-equipped to respond to the changing habits of its users

This Vision is Explicit in Section 2 of R.A. 9246 (Philippine Librarianship Act)

"The State recognizes the essential role of librarianship as a profession in developing the intellectual capacity of the citizenry thus making library service a regular component for national development. ...

Section 2 of RA 9246

It shall through honest, effective and credible licensure examination and regulatory measures, undertake programs and activities that would promote and nurture the professional growth and well-being of competent, virtuous, productive and well-rounded librarians whose standards of practice and service shall be characterized by excellence, quality, and geared towards world-class global competitiveness."

Role of Librarians

Librarians are steering Libraries towards the fulfillment of the urgent and complex mission of **sharing knowledge to users**.

They create and implement programs and services that promote **successful lifelong learning strategies**.




Laura Bush, former first lady of the US, was a librarian and school teacher. She holds a Master's degree in Library Science earned from the University of Texas, Austin


Charles Lutwidge Dodgson, aka Lewis Carroll, was Librarian at Christ Church College, Oxford before writing Alice in Wonderland







Sts. Jerome and Lawrence are known as patron saints of libraries and librarians.




St. Lawrence was in charge of archiving early church records.

Carlos L. Quirino (1910-1999)




Major Challenge: the New Breed of Information Seekers – the Millennials






- Students/professionals born from 1982-2002, who are at home with computers and digital media

Propose item for Librarians in the Local Government Code

Republic Act 9246

An Act modernizing the practice of librarianship in the Philippines thereby repealing Republic Act no. 6966, entitled: "An Act regulating the Practice of Librarianship and prescribing the qualifications of librarians," appropriating funds therefore and for other purposes.

(Signed into law by former Pres. Gloria Macapagal Arroyo on February 19, 2004)

Republic Act 7743

An Act providing for the establishment of congressional, city and municipal libraries and barangay reading centers throughout the Philippines, appropriating the necessary funds therefore and for other purposes. Enacted on June 17, 1994

Local Government Code of the Philippines

No provision for Librarian positions in LGU Libraries

Goal to 2020

To produce 50,000 competent, virtuous, productive and well-rounded librarians whose standards of practice and service shall be characterized by excellence, quality and geared towards world-class global competitiveness, to man 37,308 elementary schools, 6,000 secondary schools, 2,200 tertiary schools with an average of 2 librarians, 43,755 local gov't offices, 1,000 national gov't offices and 1,000 top corporations. Librarians who can fully develop the intellectual capacity of citizenry thus making library service a regular component for national development (R.A.# 9246).
