I	Museo Recoleta - Houses collection of religious objects, relics & memorabilia from the Augustinian Recollects in the Philippines. Lopez Museum - The museum has 14th-15th century artifacts, maps, rare books, manuscripts, Rizaliana & Filipiniana library.
II	The Rizal Shrine - As a tribute to Jose Rizal, national hero, this place has his prison cell, personal artifacts, life-size wax statue, & excerpts from his writings. Casa Manila - A reconstructed Spanish colonial house filled with antique furnitures & furnishings from the Philippines, China & Europe.
III	UST Museum - The oldest museum in the Philippines that features a diorama of Philippine fauna, religious images, ethnography & ceramic collection. San Agustin Museum - Highlighting art treasures of Filipino, Spanish, Chinese & Mexican that includes religious artifacts, relics, and other materials.
